

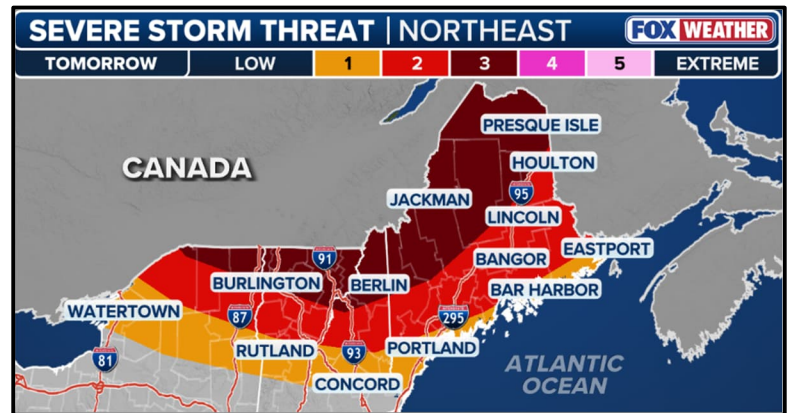

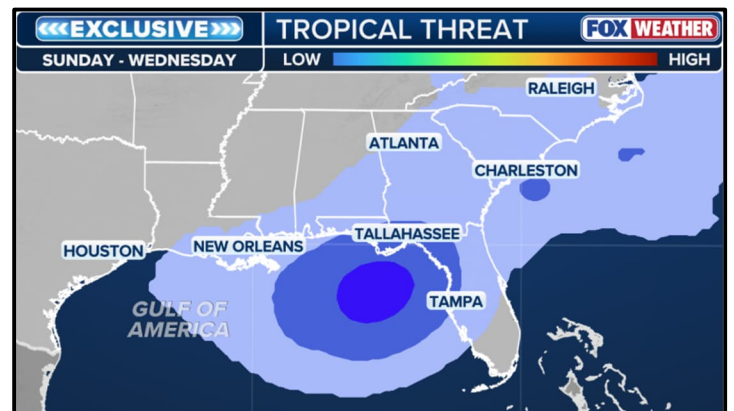
Severe Storm Threat Northeast

- A large, shifting heat dome is setting the stage for severe weather across much of New England, with increasing heat and humidity expected to fuel thunderstorms capable of producing damaging winds by midweek.
- During the afternoon and through the overnight hours on Tuesday into Wednesday, storms are expected to fire up with a primary threat of damaging wind gusts threatening much of the upper Northeast.
- A couple of tornadoes are also possible, especially near the U.S.–Canada border, where a rare threat of EF-2 or stronger tornadoes exists.
- A Level 3 out of 5 severe weather risk has been issued for parts of northern New York, Vermont, New Hampshire and much of Maine for Tuesday.
- As the heat fuels the storms, the FOX Forecast Center said the biggest cities to watch are Burlington, Vermont, Berlin, New Hampshire and Bangor, Maine.



Potential Tropical Activity – Atlantic

- The FOX Forecast Center is closely monitoring the eastern Gulf as multiple forecast models begin to indicate the potential for tropical development over the warm Gulf waters later this weekend.
- While it is too early to pinpoint the exact timing, strength or potential impacts, there is still a chance a tropical system could develop.
- Historically, most of the tropical systems that develop in July are so-called "homegrown threats" — systems that develop close to the American coastline.
- Currently, hostile winds, plumes of Saharan dust and average water temperatures are creating hostile conditions for tropical development in the open Atlantic.
- However, water temperatures remain above average in the Gulf and off the Southeast coast, opening the door to potential development.
- A weakening cold front could leave behind an area of stormy weather over the Gulf sometime this weekend, creating conditions that may allow a broad area of low pressure to spin up over the warm Gulf waters.
- The next named storm of the 2026 Atlantic hurricane season would be "Bertha."



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Tropical Activity – Pacific

Disturbance 1

- Located several hundred miles S of the coast of southwestern Mexico moving WNW.
- Conditions favorable for gradual development; tropical depression likely to form during the early to middle part of this week.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Med (50%); 7-day: High (90%)

Disturbance 2

- Located WSW of the Baja California peninsula moving WNW into less favorable conditions, with development chances decreasing.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Low (10%)

Disturbance 3

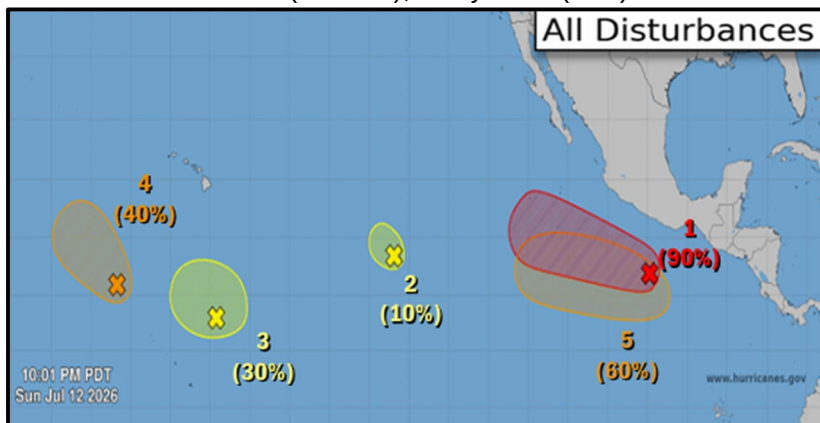
- Located several hundred miles S of the Hawaiian Islands
- Minimal movement; gradual development of this system is possible during the next several days.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Low (30%)

Disturbance 4

- Located several hundred miles SW of the Hawaiian Islands moving WNW.
- Conditions appear favorable for gradual development during the next several days
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (20%); 7-day: Med (40%)

Disturbance 5

- Located offshore of Southern and Southwestern Mexico moving WNW
- Conditions appear conducive for gradual development of this system and a tropical depression could form by the end of the week or weekend.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Med (60%)
