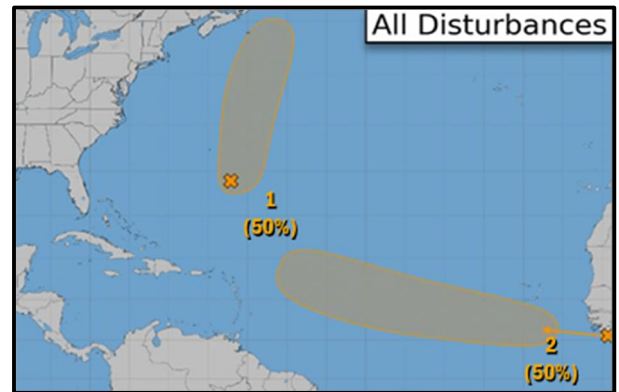
WSP USA FIELD SERVICES DISASTER AWARENESS REPORT

August 24, 2026

Tropical Activity – Atlantic

Disturbance 1

- Area of low pressure is located a few hundred miles SE of Bermuda.
- Further development is possible, and the system could become a short-lived tropical depression or storm during the next couple of days.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Medium (50%); 7-day: Medium (50%)



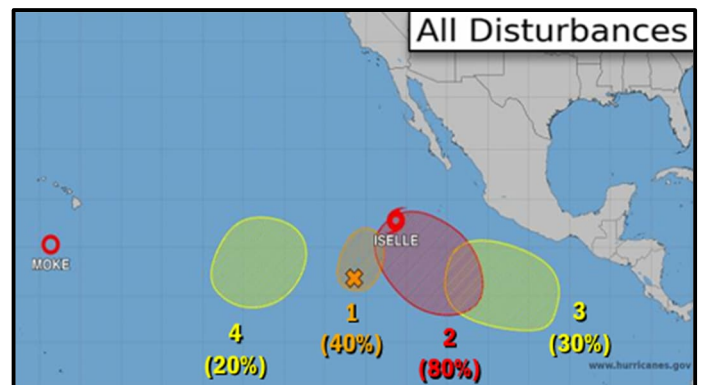
Disturbance 2

- Tropical wave expected to move off the west coast of Africa later today and area of low pressure could form in association with the wave early this week.
- Environmental conditions are forecast to be marginally conducive for development, and a tropical depression could form by the middle to latter portions of this week.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Medium (50%)

Tropical Activity – Eastern & Central Pacific

Tropical Depression Moke

- Located 380 miles SW of Hilo Hawaii moving W at 13 mph.
- Maximum sustained winds of 35 mph.
- The center of Moke will pass SW of the Big Island of Hawaii today and well S of the smaller main Hawaiian Islands.
- Moke is forecast to degenerate to a remnant low later today and dissipate on Tuesday.



Tropical Storm Iselle

- Located 540 mi SW of the southern tip of Baja California moving NW at 12 mph.
- Maximum sustained winds of 60 mph.
- Tropical storm-force winds extend outwards up to 125 miles from center.
- Some strengthening is expected over the next day or so.
- Iselle could become a short-lived hurricane by late tonight.
- Gradual weakening is forecast to start on Tuesday.

Disturbance 1

- Located well SW of the Baja California peninsula.

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- Conditions could support a short-lived tropical depression during the next day or so before it merges with Tropical Storm Iselle.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Med (40%); 7-day: Med (40%)

Disturbance 2

- Expected to develop well S of the Baja California peninsula.
- A tropical depression is likely to form later this week or over the weekend.
- Formation chance – 48 hours: Low (near 0%); 7 days: High (80%)

Disturbance 3

- Area of low pressure could form well offshore of Central America late this week.
- Conditions conducive for gradual development of this system over the weekend while moving WNW at 10-15 mph.
- Formation chance – 48 hours: Low (near 0%); 7 days: Low (30%)

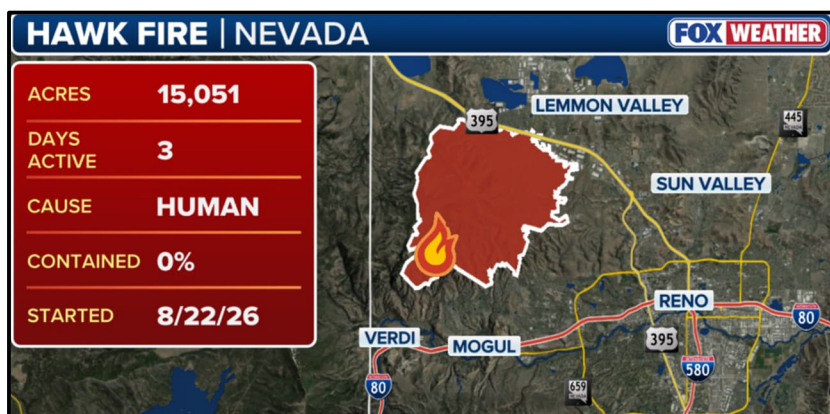
Disturbance 4

- Low pressure forecast to form well to the ESE of the Hawaiian Islands.
- Some slow development of this system is possible later this week.
- Formation chance – 48 hours: Low (near 0%); 7 days: Low (20%)

Wildfire Activity

Nevada – Hawk Fire

- A fast-moving, “human-caused” wildfire near Reno, Nevada, has forced thousands to evacuate and injured six, with strong, unpredictable winds complicating fire-fighting efforts.
- The Hawk Fire was first reported Saturday morning.
- As of Sunday evening, the fire had spread to 15,000 acres, with zero containment, and state and county disasters had been declared.
- Nearly 90,000 people live in evacuation order or evacuation warning zones in the Washoe County area, along Nevada’s border with California. The red “go now” zones extend into north-west Reno, a city of 280,000. Authorities warned evacuees to be prepared to stay away for two days.
- Authorities said structures had been damaged, but the full scale of the damage is not yet known.



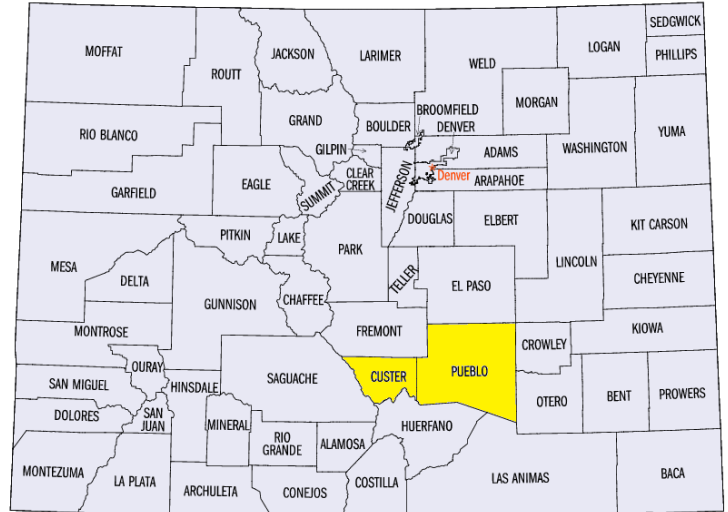
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Disaster Declaration Request Colorado

- Gov. Jared Polis on Sunday requested a Major Disaster Declaration from President Trump and the Federal Emergency Management Agency after two different large-scale wildfires destroyed hundreds of homes and disrupted local economies this summer.
- The Aspen Acres Fire burned more than 100,000 acres in southern Colorado and the Gold Mountain Fire near Ouray in western Colorado burned nearly 40,000 acres.
- Firefighters are still working to get full containment on both fires, and flooding is now a problem in and around both burn scars. Earlier this month, a man died in the Aspen Acres burn area when he was swept away in floodwaters.
- The request seeks individual assistance for Pueblo and Custer counties after the two fires burned more than 140,000 acres, destroyed 324 homes, damaged critical infrastructure and forced the evacuation of about 11,600 residents.



Aftermath of Hurricane Lala Hawaii

- Before Moke reached Hawaii Island, county crews assessed some of the damage from Hurricane Lala.
- As of Sunday, officials said Lala destroyed more than 200 homes and 15 businesses. Roads still need repairs, and power across the island has not been fully restored.
- Lala brought approximately 20 to 40 inches of rain to some areas, triggering severe flooding, runoff and landslides.
- The rural Ka'u District experienced some of the most severe impacts.
- At the height of the storm, approximately 200,000 customers across Hawai'i Island, Maui and O'ahu lost power. Although service has largely been restored on Maui and O'ahu, approximately 11,290 customers on Hawai'i Island remained without electricity when the request was submitted. In some severely affected areas, restoration may extend through Sept. 8.
- The Hawaii Emergency Management Agency (HIEMA) is preparing to request a federal disaster declaration after damage assessments from Tropical Storm Lala.
- On August 22, 2026, Governor Josh Green requested an emergency declaration for Hawai'i County, Maui County, and the City and County of Honolulu.
