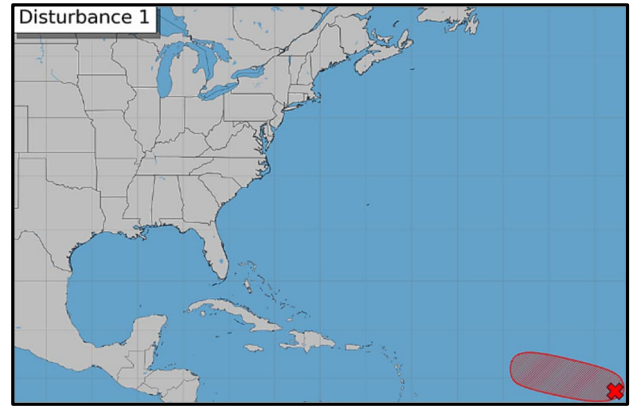
WSP USA FIELD SERVICES DISASTER AWARENESS REPORT

August 27, 2026

Tropical Activity – Atlantic

Disturbance 1

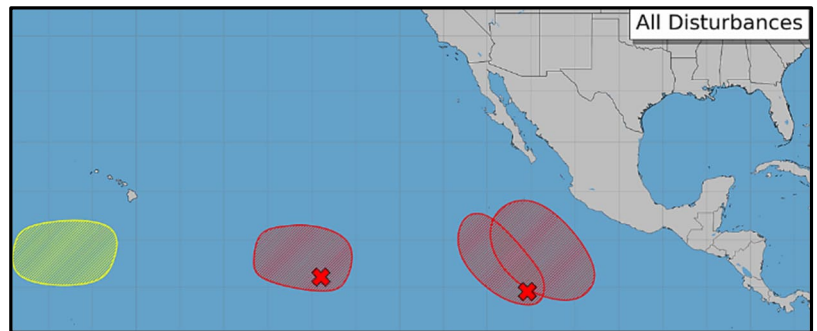
- Located about midway between Africa and the Windward Islands and has become better organized overnight.
- If the current trends continue, advisories could be initiated on a short-lived tropical storm later today.
- Conditions are expected to become hostile beginning on Friday, likely ending its chances for further development.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: High (90%); 7-day: High (90%)



Tropical Activity – Eastern & Central Pacific

Disturbance 1

- Located 900 miles south of the southern tip of Baja California Peninsula.
- Conditions are expected to support continued development of this system and a tropical depression expected to form later today or tonight.
- Forecasted to move WNW at 10 to 15 mph.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: High (90%); 7-day: High (90%)



Disturbance 2

- Located well to the ESE of the Hawaiian Islands and has become a little better organized.
- Conditions appear conducive for gradual development, and a tropical depression is likely to form over the next days.
- Drifting to the northeast, before turning westward this weekend.
- Formation chance – 48 hours: High (70%); 7 days: High (90%)

Disturbance 3

- Area of low pressure is forecast to form this weekend well to the south of southwestern Mexico.
- A tropical depression is likely to form early next week while it moves westward to the WNW at 10 to 15 mph.
- Formation chance – 48 hours: Low (near 0%); 7 days: High (80%)

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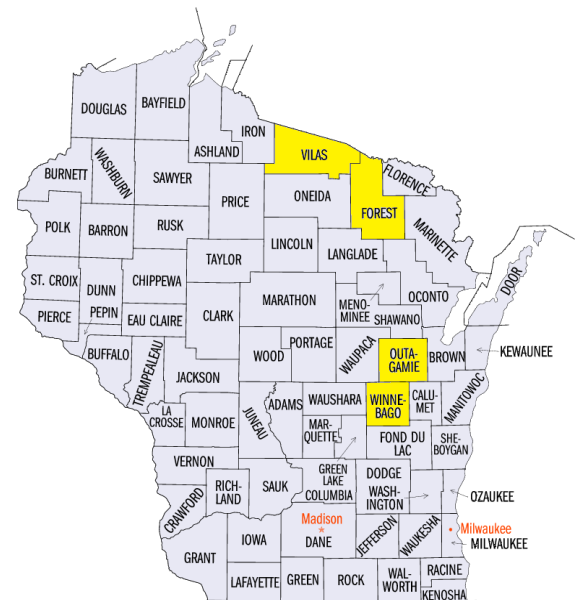
Disturbance 4

- An area of low pressure could form well south of the Hawaiian Islands over the weekend or early next week.
- Some gradual development is possible thereafter while the system moves slowly WNW well south-southwest of the Hawaiian Islands.
- Formation chance – 48 hours: Low (near 0%); 7 days: Low (20%)

Disaster Declaration Activity

Wisconsin

- On July 27, 2026, storms triggered a confirmed EF-3 tornado in the Menasha and Appleton areas.
- The tornado developed just west-northwest of Appleton around noon and traveled south through Fox Crossing and Menasha, eventually dissipating over Lake Winnebago. The National Weather Service estimated peak winds of approximately 140 mph.
- Remaining on the ground for roughly 20–25 minutes and traveled about 12 miles, causing severe structural damage.
- Hail of 2–3 inches was reported in several areas, with a 4.5-inch hailstone near Gresham in Shawano County.
- High winds, hail, and power outages caused widespread damage across Forest, Outagamie, Vilas, and Winnebago counties, also disrupting local public water systems.
- Following the July storms, Evers declared a state of emergency and deployed the Wisconsin National Guard to support recovery efforts in Winnebago County.
- Joint assessments by Wisconsin Emergency Management and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) found more than 2,340 homes revealed another \$8.2 million in residential damage.
- On Aug 26, Gov. Tony Evers has formally requested a federal disaster declaration from President Donald Trump.
- Evers' request to the White House and FEMA includes individual assistance for impacted residents and families in Forest, Outagamie, Vilas, and Winnebago counties.



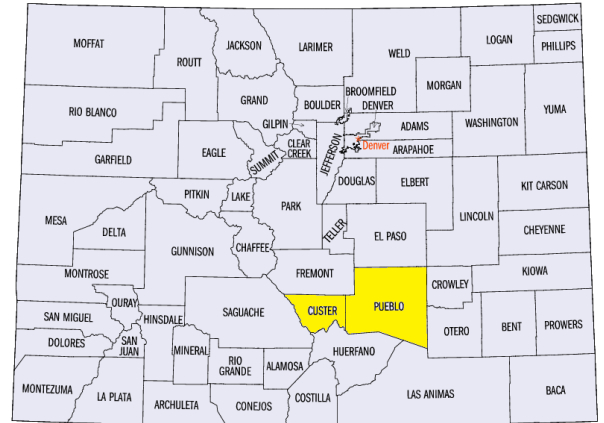
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Colorado

- On August 23, 2026, Colorado Gov. Jared Polis formally requested a Major Disaster Declaration from FEMA and the President for the Aspen Acres and Gold Mountain wildfires, including the flooding and debris flows that followed the fires.
- The Aspen Acres Fire started on June 29, 2026 and has become one of Colorado's most significant wildfire disasters of 2026, and the situation has continued to affect residents even after the main fire activity decreased.
- The Aspen Acres fire burned approximately 102,000 acres and destroyed 324 homes. More than 11,500 people in Pueblo, Custer and Fremont counties were evacuated at some point.
- The fire footprint remains about 102,004 acres, with containment reaching 82% by August 26.
- State and federal officials determined that 270 of the 324 destroyed homes met the requirements for potential FEMA Individual Assistance if the federal disaster request is approved.
- One of the most important aspects for a FEMA IA analysis is that the disaster did not end when the wildfire was contained.
- The burned landscape has created a major flash-flood and debris-flow hazard. Heavy summer rainfall has sent ash, mud and debris down the burn scar into communities including Beulah.
