

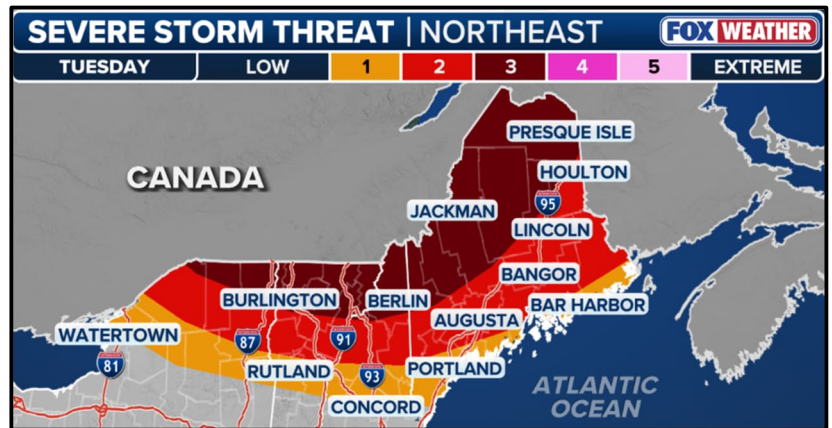

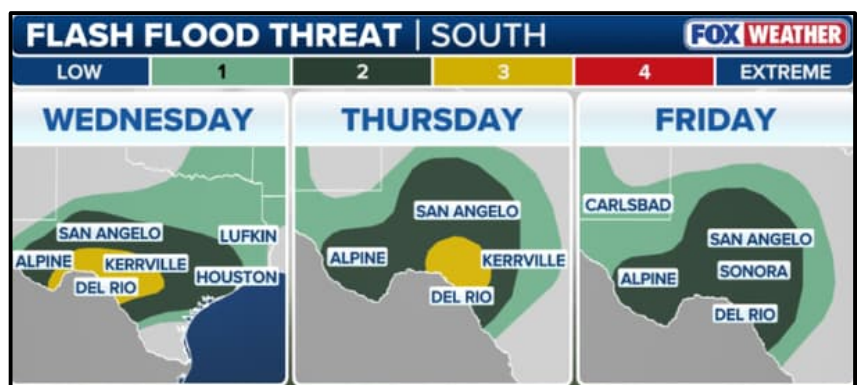
Severe Storm Threat Northeast

- A rare severe weather threat is targeting nearly 2 million people across northern New England and New York's North Country beginning Tuesday afternoon, with thunderstorms capable of producing hurricane-force wind gusts and even tornadoes in a region that rarely experiences intense severe weather.
- The greatest risk of the strongest storms will be across parts of northern Maine, northern New Hampshire, northern Vermont and New York's North Country.
- NOAA's Storm Prediction Center (SPC) has issued a Level 3 out of 5 risk of severe thunderstorms that includes Presque Isle and Jackman, Maine, Berlin, New Hampshire, Burlington, Vermont and Plattsburgh.
- These areas could see EF-2 tornadoes, damaging wind gusts up to 75 mph and egg-sized hail within the most intense storms.
- A Level 2 severe storm threat covers areas just south, including Bangor and Augusta, Maine.
- The forecast currently has the worst of the storms developing in the late afternoon, which could limit some of the severe weather impacts due to a loss of the peak of the daytime heat.



Flash Flood Threat Texas

- Days of storms will dump heavy rain over millions of people across parts of the South, Gulf Coast and Texas through Friday, bringing a mounting flood threat, particularly over Texas' Big Bend and Hill Country regions, where storms are expected to repeatedly track over the same areas.
- This also includes vulnerable areas along the Guadalupe River in Texas Hill Country that saw devastating flooding last July 4 that killed 135 people.
- Currently, a considerable flash flood warning is in effect for Medina County, Texas, where radar estimates a staggering 9 inches of rain has fallen near Hondo over the past six hours.



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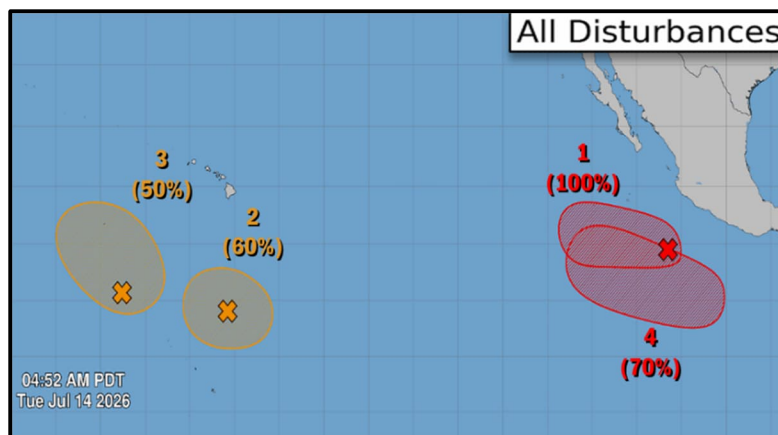
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- Flood Watches are in place through Thursday across central and southwestern Texas—including Austin, Kerrville, and Del Rio—where the National Weather Service warns of potential life-threatening flooding.
- On Tuesday, the flood threat will position itself primarily over central Texas—including Austin and San Antonio—where a Level 2 out of 4 risk is in place.
- Additionally, a Level 3 out of 4 threat is in place Tuesday through Wednesday for a small area of southwestern Texas, including Del Rio.
- The Weather Prediction Center notes this area could be the bullseye for rain totals, with multi-day accumulation approaching 10 inches and rainfall rates of 3 to 4 inches an hour possible in the strongest downpours.
- By the middle of the week, storms are poised to dump between 5 and 8 inches of rain across West and Southwest Texas, including Hill Country.

Tropical Activity – Pacific

Disturbance 1

- Located a few hundred miles SSW of the coast of southwestern Mexico moving WNW.
- Conditions favorable for gradual development; tropical depression is expected to form today or tonight.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: High (90%); 7-day: High (100%)



Disturbance 2

- Located several hundred miles S of the Hawaiian Islands.
- Minimal movement; tropical depression could form over the next day or two.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Med (60%); 7-day: Med (60%)

Disturbance 3

- Located several hundred miles SW of the Hawaiian Islands moving WNW.
- System could become a tropical depression later in the week.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (30%); 7-day: Med (50%)

Disturbance 4

- Located offshore of southern and southwestern Mexico moving WNW.
- Tropical depression could form by the end of the weekend.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: High (70%)
